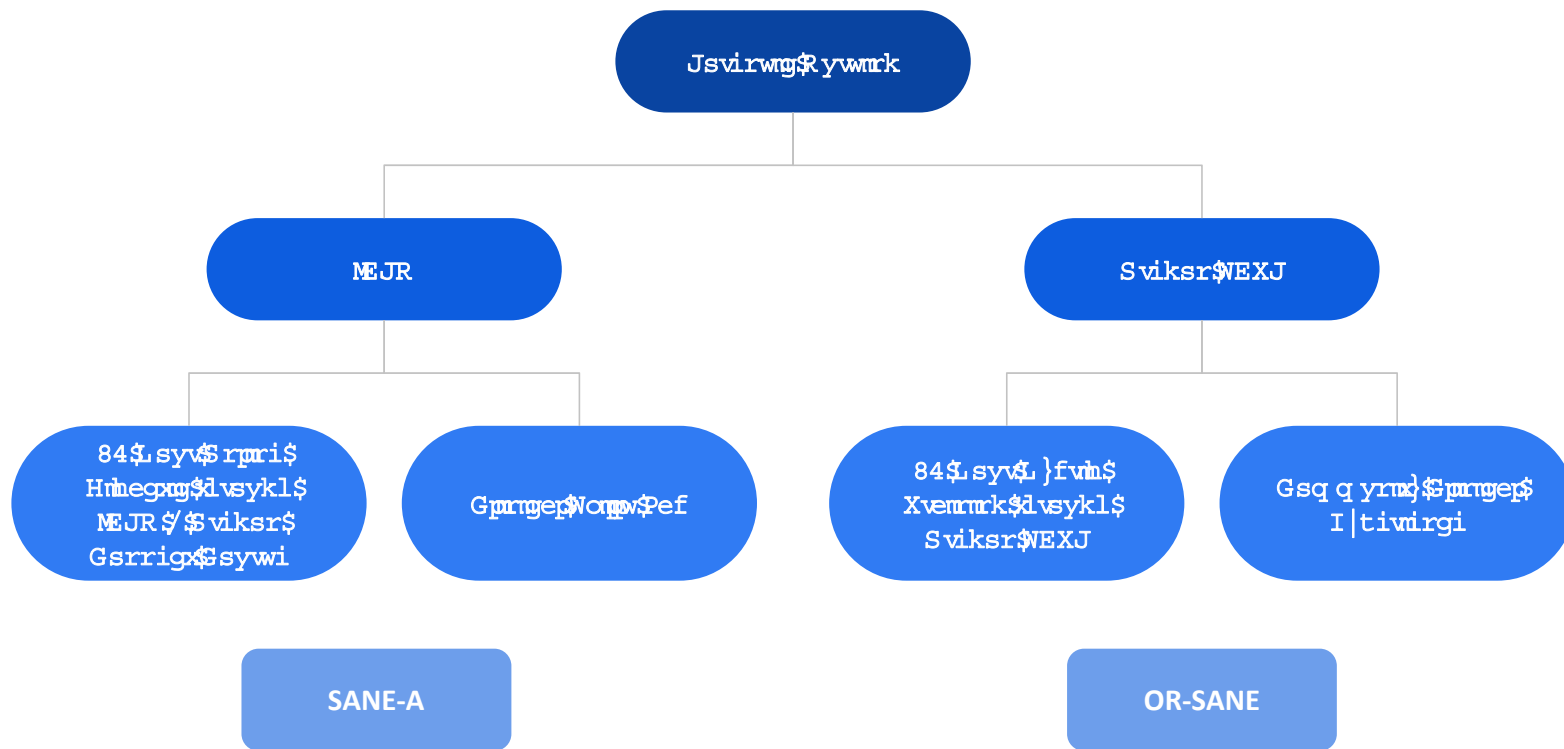

# 40-Hour SANE Training through IAFN

## Didactic Portion Covers

- History taking
- Physical exam
- Medical-forensic photography
- Medical-forensic specimen collection
- Sexually Transmitted Infection Prophylaxis and Emergency Contraception
- Courtroom testimony and legal considerations

11 Modules within 12 weeks → Certificate



# Clinical Skills Lab



2-day training covering physical examination components in a stress-free environment

Improve examination competency utilizing Gynecological Teaching Associates

## Practice:

- Trauma-informed history taking
- Draping patients for privacy
- Speculum insertion
- Caring for special populations
- Forensic photography
- Potential evidence collection

# SANE-A Certification

Board Certification

Taken after 300 hours of clinical practice

Receive a SANE-A - Adult/Adolescent

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If desired, a pediatric certificate and certification are also possible through the didactic coursework, clinical skills training/preceptorship, and practice hours.

Oregon has competency requirements to practice as a SANE  
(OSBN Interpretive Statement)

- 10 pelvic speculum exams
- 1 exam observation
- 3 precepted/independent exams  
(2 may be mock exams)

- Criminal Court Observation
- District Attorney Observation
- Victim Services Observation

## Tides of Change Community-Based SANE Program

- ToC will employ an RN, SANE-certified Program Manager
- All SANEs will be employees of ToC
- SANE exams will take place at Adventist Women and Family Health Center after the patient has had an ED medical exam
- SANEs will receive on-call compensation and payment for every exam completed
- Interested RNs are eligible to have the SANE certification paid for under the ToC program in exchange for 18 months of commitment working with the ToC program

# SANEs Make a Difference

Victim-centered, trauma-informed forensic exams are a critical part of survivors' healing.
